Session #23 "Engaging Young Adults" Speaker, Armando Cervantes, Director of Youth and Young Adults, Diocese of Orange, Ca.

Generation Z: loyal to brands, organizations, and purchase what they *Trust!* Over 50 percent give money to charity and they do volunteer, "don't think they can't give or serve"

Millennials: spend money on experiences, 55 percent donate to charity/33 percent volunteer. We are not good at showing how good the Catholic Church is in giving to those in need...share our giving stories and how it changes lives.

Communicate loudly and funny, talk about traditions, tell stories about their ancestors. Hispanics bring their customs with them. Show them how their customs relate to Church. Major form of communication is cell phones. Bottom line: "You have to ask, if you don't ask you don't get" <u>Link</u>

Mass count is important. Know who/keep track of those who participate in the "sacraments, school enrollment, etc. As much details as available, not just numbers. We must see everyone, especially, those who hope to not be noticed.

What is an active member, what is an inactive member? Who are the 20%? Find out as much about the 80%. Find out their needs before asking for anything. Grow the inner circle and close the gaps. Be aware that there is a gap, plus 6 other session topics: Link
