Our SNG group met at Sacred Heart of Jesus in Manvel for our January meeting topic "Many Ministries, One Mission". Thank you Michele for being the host and to Fr. Tom for his participation in our group discussions. Below are some of the sharing:

- Education on the danger of "Silo Effect"! We are many parts and that's good thing! Be aware of a lack of communication and common goals, isolation and departmental thinking. We are One Body called to our parish mission, called to collaborate and bring people to Christ, by, being example, communicating, sharing ideas, and giving people a voice. Each part is important to the whole, but it is just PART of the whole.

- The book "Leading Like Jesus" (introducing S3 Leadership, Servant, Steward, Shepherd) by Owen Phelps) Leadership challenges - what is our purposes who is our Leader? Developing and cultivating our leaders so they may in turn do the same for other parishioners.
- Question: "We have many ministries in the parish, a large Hispanic community, how do we keep from becoming 2 churches?
 - 1. Communicate, Communicate, Communicate! It is always a struggle when you have different languages in the parish, so it is important that "all" here the same message (especially messages coming from the pastor). If we want "all" to be on the same page we must make it a priority to reach out and make available messages in the proper languages.
 - 2. Invite ministries leaders for a quarterly or annual gathering include staff, parish councils, clergy). Work on an activity for all to get to know each other. Use the time to do education on parish mission and goals. Give updates on future parish plans.
 - 3. Invite different ministries to participate in a monthly event such as: sponsor coffee/donuts; feature a ministry of the month after Mass or bulletin article with update on parish ministries. "Make your ministries feel they are a piece of what it takes to make your parish function.
 - 4. Provide education events to help ministries feel a part of the parish mission, including the U.S. Bishops Pastoral Letter on Stewardship A Disciples' Response.
 - 5. An annual review of parish ministries: Does it support our parish mission? Is this ministry in line with mission of the parish?
 - 6. Never give up, reach out ask for advise and help. We don't know all the answers, but, we have tried many things and may know what does work! Contact the Stewardship Networking Group, see contact information below.
