Wisdom from Catholic Stewardship Conference

There were many great sessions at the 2020 ICSC! I would like to share some wisdom I gained.

The session entitled *Tithes of Saints: Cultivating Leadership Donors* was given by Dennis Green of Church Development. The first message I received was that we are **servants of our members**. We need always consider how do we facilitate their faith journey.

When presented with the question "why people don't give generously", the following four reasons were given:

Obfuscation-messages were made difficult to understand Isolation-they do not feel like they belong

Never asking

No investment in development

Reasons people do give generously are:

Embrace Stewardship-they understand what it is

Prayer and Discernment-these need to be at the foundation of giving

Involvement in a decision-they are able to provide input and feel they belong

Social Connection-they have a social connection/belong to a group

Volunteer Engagement-this more than just asking people to fill positions

They have been asked-it is recommended to ask 4 times a year

Thanked-they are thanked for giving

Another great message that I heard was from Thomas Smith. His talk was entitled *Major Gifts: Don't let the Pandemic Slow you Down.*The message was that Christian Stewardship is an opportunity for parishioners. I believe that we often forget that. It is an opportunity for them to live out their faith.

In the session entitled *Blessed are the Communicators: They Shall Inspire Great Stewardship*, we learned that that three types of messages provide information, inspiration or invitation or a combination of all three. Types of messages include awareness, action (call to) and alerts. They also recommended taking stagnant information out of the bulletin and putting it on the parish website.

I pray that these have helped in some way. Remember that the first part of Stewardship is time. Time is Time spent in prayer and needs to be the foundation for everything we do!!

Staff Assessment:

- Look back 7 months and see what worked. At the beginning maybe people loved it, but, did it get boring?
- Is there value to your pages, does it have a purpose?
- Does it set you apart, is it unique to your parish or do you have same message as everyone else?
- Do research, what is working for others/ other parishes?
- Posting from your phone seems to work better, gets more hits!
- Do at least one live-stream a day.
- Have one or two media channels and do them well.
- Respond to comments/likes and "thank them"
- Pastor gets more likes on his twitter account than parish
- Post daily, use parishioner's photos, comments, etc
